Joint Recreation Master Plan Moves Forward Following City/Township Survey

The Charter Township of Plymouth and the City of Plymouth are conducting a first-of-its-kind Joint Recreation Master Plan, with a completion date of May 1, 2018. A Recreation Master Plan is required by State Law and often by other governmental and private funding sources, and must be developed every five years. The joint master plan should enhance our ability to attract grants, and may lead to enhanced recreational opportunities between our two communities. The consultant hired by the City and Township will conduct a series of public meetings and workshops to seek input and advice from the communities, and will use the results of a telephone survey conducted by EPIC-MRA of Lansing back in September.

Township Continues Sewer Manhole 'Uncovering' Program

The township is continuing a community-wide program to uncover and restore to grade more than 200 buried sanitary sewer manholes that are covered up and inaccessible.

All buried manholes will be raised to surface grade for full and permanent exposure and accessibility. Homeowners with a buried manhole(s) on their property will be notified by letter at least two weeks in advance of the uncovering and adjustment work. This project will continue into the spring of 2018.

Recycling Reminders

Plymouth Township offers year round curbside recycling to our residents. All single family residences and multiple family residences that utilize our solid waste services should have a green 65 gallon recycling cart. If you do not, please call the Solid Waste Department at 734.354.3270 ext. 4, so that you are able to participate in this important program. For a list of acceptable items, go to www.plymouthtwp.org and search the word "recycling".

It is important to note that plastic bags are not accepted as a part of our curbside collection. As an alternative, most local grocery and retail stores offer plastic bag recycling. Kroger, Meijer, Kohl's, Target and Wal-Mart are a few of the retailers that offer a drop-off location for plastic bags.

Please be aware all items must fit inside the recycling cart in order for it to be collected for recycling. Items placed outside the cart will NOT be collected by the automated recycling truck. During this gift buying season it is important to break down all boxes so they fit inside the recycling cart. If you have an overflow of boxes, please call the Solid Waste Department for an alternative way to have the boxes recycled.

A Message About Snow and Snow Emergencies in Plymouth Township

Winter is coming! And with the season here in Michigan we can expect more than our share of heavy snow days, closing schools, and making driving and walking a challenge.

The Township wants to remind residents and guests about the following snow-related items:

- » Plymouth Township does not plow streets; this is the responsibility of Wayne County Roads or your own Homeowner's Association by private contract.
- » The Township only salts sidewalks and pathways on township-owned property; Wayne County Roads or your Homeowner's Association salts streets.
- » Residents and businesses must remove snow and ice from their adjacent sidewalks within 24 hours of a snow or ice event or be subject to an ordinance violation.
- » Plymouth Township does not issue "Snow Emergencies," but when you hear of a Snow Emergency on TV or radio, please be considerate and move your vehicle off the street so County or contracted snow plows can do their job.

2018 Budget Approved by Township Board; Credit Rating Up

The 2018 Township Budget was approved by a majority of the Township Board in November, six weeks ahead of schedule, following several months of review and discussion by the Board and public. The township used zero-based budgeting standards to develop a 2018 budget with revenues of \$14.7 million and expenditures of \$14.4 million, leaving a surplus of \$311,000 and a healthy fund balance of nearly \$4 million. The Township's credit rating also improved in the second half of the year to 'AA+' status.

Township Seeks Residents to Serve on Boards and Commissions

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees recently passed a new policy to encourage residents to apply for positions on the township's various boards and commissions.

The policy requires residents to apply either in person or online with Township Clerk, who will then coordinate with the Supervisor and the Township's Board of Trustees to recommend qualified candidates for the various positions.

Plymouth Township depends on our boards and commissions to make key decisions on zoning, planning, tax abatement, economic development, and hiring, to name a few. We need responsible citizens with a commitment to our community to serve in these important roles.

Boards and Commissions in the township include the Zoning Board of Appeals, Planning Commission, Downtown Development Authority, Brownfield Authority, Civil Service Commission, and Board of Review.

Railroad Crossing Information

The Township has been receiving numerous complaints related to CSX Railroad blocking crossings in the Township for extended periods of time.

CSX Railroad Trains are regulated by the Federal Government and the local units of government or the City have no authority over trains or how long they block crossings. Our best recommendation is to contact your federal legislators and request relief.

To report trains blocking crossings we recommend that you contact all of the following each time there is a train blocking a crossing:



Created in March of this year, the all-volunteer Plymouth
Township Citizens Advisory Council was empowered to provide
ideas and suggestions to the Board of Trustees for improving
Township operations, services and standards. The Citizens Advisory
Council was comprised of five committees – Public Safety, Economic
Development, Government Accountability, Arts, Recreation and
Culture, and Environmental Stewardship. More than 100 residents
were involved in the process at some point in the year.
